

<p>Fiction Reading Fair Projects Example: Little Red Hen</p> <p style="text-align: center;">By Lucy Dixon, River Christian Academy</p> <p>(Students are NOT to write their names anywhere on the front of the board. I ask them to write their name in pencil on the back, bottom left corner of the board).</p>	<p>(4) Main Characters and (5) Setting</p> <p>The MAIN CHARACTERS are the ones who are most important to the story. Example - The main characters are the Little Red Hen, Duck, Goose, Pig, and Cat.</p> <p>The SETTING is the time and place of the story. Example - The setting is on a farm during the day.</p>
<p>Projects Must Contain the Following Elements: (Must be titled on board)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Title 2. Author 3. Publisher and publication date 4. Main Characters 5. Setting 6. Tone/Mood 7. Author's Purpose 8. Plot Summary 9. Conflict 10. Resolution 	<p>(6) Tone or Mood</p> <p>How did the author want you to feel when writing the story? How did it make you feel? Write in complete sentences.</p> <p>Example - I think the mood of the story is fun because of the way the characters repeat the same phrases when asked for help.</p>
<p>(1) Title and (2) Author</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The TITLE is the name of the book. • The AUTHOR is the person who wrote the book. 	<p>(7) Author's Purpose</p> <p>Tell in a complete sentence why the author wrote this book.</p> <p>Example - The author's purpose was to entertain with a funny story about what happens when you don't help others.</p>
<p>(3) Publisher and Publication Date</p> <p>The NAME OF THE PUBLISHER can be found on the verso* page (sometimes called the copyright page). The verso is the back of the title page. The DATE THE BOOK WAS PUBLISHED can also be found on the verso page. HINT: It is usually found after a little c with a circle around it like this: ©1999. Publication date of 1999.</p>	<p>(8) Plot Summary</p> <p>A brief description of the order of events in the story. Use complete sentences.</p> <p>Example - In this story, the Little Red Hen tries to get her friends to help her complete all of the tasks involved in baking the bread. No one will help her bake the bread, so she does it all by herself.</p>
